If the current Plan of Care has not changed, you can simply sign and date it and return in September. If your child has any medication at school, please make arrangements to have the medication picked up or sent home prior to the end of the school year.

GRADE 8 STUDENTS - MESSAGE ABOUT COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT HOURS

The District School Board of Niagara encourages all students to explore a wide variety of community experiences and activities in order to develop an understanding of the various roles they can play in their community and to help them develop a greater sense of belonging within their community. As part of the Ontario secondary school diploma requirements, every student is required to complete a minimum 40 hours of community involvement. These activities may be completed at any time starting the summer before a student enters Grade 9 and after reviewing the expectations and regulations. Students are encouraged to complete their hours early in their high school career.

Students can access the D2L resources using their DSBN student login and password. By visiting https://dsbn.org and clicking Staff and Student Login, where they will have access to the D2L icon and login. In this space, students will have access to the information about eligible and ineligible activities, and a link to search for volunteer opportunities in the Niagara Region.

Before starting a volunteer experience, students need to watch the video and review the materials in the D2L course, so they understand the expectations and know what is eligible as an activity. We do not want students participating in an activity that risks their safety and well-being or disappoint them to learn their experience was not eligible after their participation.

Information has been shared with all of our Grade 8s during class time.

Registration for DSBN's instrumental music program for 2024-2025 is now open. All students entering Grades 3 to 8 next fall are eligible to take part in this enriching program. Parents are encouraged to go to the program's website (neimusic.com) for more information and to register.

CLASS PLACEMENT INFORMATION

We are already looking ahead to the new school year and will soon begin the process of organizing next year's classes. In developing our new class structure, our goal is to ensure your children have an outstanding educational experience in an inviting and welcoming classroom community.

Our classes work best when they include members of differing interests, abilities, and perspectives. This gives students the opportunity to learn from and about each other. These experiences help to open students' minds to new ideas and new possibilities, allowing them to test limits and develop their true potential.

To do this, it's important for us to look at a number of factors, including:

Learning Style: We consider how students learn best and which classroom environment will best support their needs.

Ability, Interests and Talents: All children are unique and have their own set of strengths and abilities. Having a grouping of students whose strengths compliment each other will help enhance everyone's learning.

Relationships: We aim to create groups that allow for respectful and caring peer relationships with opportunities to meet new students as well as spending time with some familiar friends.

Families will receive an email in the morning of Friday, August 30, 2024 with the students' September class placement.

MENTAL HEALTH AND WELL-BEING SUMMER LEARNING OPPORTUNITY

For students entering Grades 6 to 12, DSBN Youth Counsellors will be offering 12 sessions of engaging virtual group programming. Students will learn evidence-based skills and strategies to manage stress and anxiety, based on a dialectical behaviour therapy (DBT) skills program developed for use in schools. The groups will meet online via MS Teams two times per week in the afternoons, for one-hour sessions. Students will be grouped with peers in their same grade, with a maximum group size of 10 students.

NSTS BACK-TO-SCHOOL STUDENT TRANSPORTATION

At the end of August, Niagara Student Transportation Services (NSTS) will post specific back to school transportation arrangements for each student that qualifies for busing, including bus route numbers, stop locations and times.

Please visit http://www.nsts.ca and sign-in to the secure parent portal to get your child's student transportation information. To sign-in to the portal you will need your child's Ontario Education Number (OEN) which can be found on their report card. While signed-in, please subscribe to the delay and cancellation module for direct and timely emails regarding student transportation that impacts your child's bus route.

Eligibility information is also available through the portal including walking directions if your child lives within the walk zone of the school and is not eligible for transportation service. Changes to home, pick-up or drop-off addresses must be made through your child's school. During the summer you may notify NSTS of address changes so we can make sure a bus stop is available for your child to start the school year, however, NSTS is not authorized to change student address information.

With the availability of the secure parent portal, NSTS will not mail student transportation notices with the exception of Kindergarten students or new students to the system who do not have an OEN to sign-in to the portal. Please contact your school or NSTS if you have questions regarding your child's transportation arrangements.

Please note that if you have opted-in your child/children for student transportation for this school year (2023/24), there is no need to opt-in again for next school year (2024/25).
